
Changes in leadership may have impacted the way business was conducted within the committee, as well as the completion of PBC goals.

Assessment Areas



Response rate: 54% (7 out of 13)


Findings for Purpose, Goals & Tasks




Completion of PBC Goals

Accomplishments Mentioned by Respondents

- Voiced end of meeting wrap-ups for easier communication to constituent groups.
- Implemented major tasks of PBC listed in the PBC charter.
- Completed a round of scoring for annual budget requests, though the process was not finished.

Improvements Mentioned by Respondents

- Representative stakeholders need to be included in the planning process.
 As PBC members we must participate. The same applies to the goal setting associated with unit plans.
- Offer training of new PBC members
- Start with PBC training in planning and budgeting. We didn't.
- Develop more awareness about the responsibilities that PBC members have as individuals
