SENATE DISCUSSION: PROPOSED CHANGES TO ECC PD DAYS

- Background: Flexible Calendar
 - The Flexible Calendar programs allows for colleges to set aside days for staff professional development (PD) in lieu of regular instruction (classes are cancelled on those days).
 - Sources: <u>CCCO Flexible Calendar Website</u> and Guidelines for the Implementation of the Flexible Calendar Program (<u>PDF</u>)
- At ECC, we set aside 4 days of PD per academic year (@6 hours a day-FT faculty are required to do 24 hours of PD each academic year)
 - The <u>AFT contract</u> (page 46) states that out of the 24 required hours, FT faculty are required to do 9 hours during Fall and Spring Professional Development days (6 hours in Fall and 3 hours in Spring) which are scheduled on the first day of each semester.




SENATE DISCUSSION: PROPOSED CHANGES TO ECC PD DAYS CONT.

- PD day survey (N=70 FT faculty) indicated majority of respondents would like to see a reduction in the required 9 hours of PD on Fall and Spring PD days (24 hours of PD will still be required per year).
- Proposal: Reduce to 6 hours of PD required for FT faculty each academic year
 - o 3 hours on Fall and Spring PD days (10am-1pm) with optional PD activities during rest of day
- Options for scheduling PD days:
 - Keep PD days scheduled on the first day of each semester
 - Move PD days to a day during approximately week four of each semester (Calendar committee can identify a day that least impacts instruction)
 - Rationale:
 - Move PD day to a time that is not as busy (beginning of the semester is when students need support the most and faculty a busy prepping for the semester)
 - Will feel more like a day truly set aside for PD rather than having to come to PD day before the semester starts
 - If the Calendar committee chooses a day to do PD day on a weekday where there are not other holidays scheduled, class time will not have to be made up (15 meeting days are allowable during a 16-week semester)


SENATE DISCUSSION: PROPOSED CHANGES TO ECC PD DAYS CONT.

 - Las Positas: Thursday, October 24 and Thursday, March 20
 - Chaffey College: April 22, 2025










