


Academic Senate Meeting

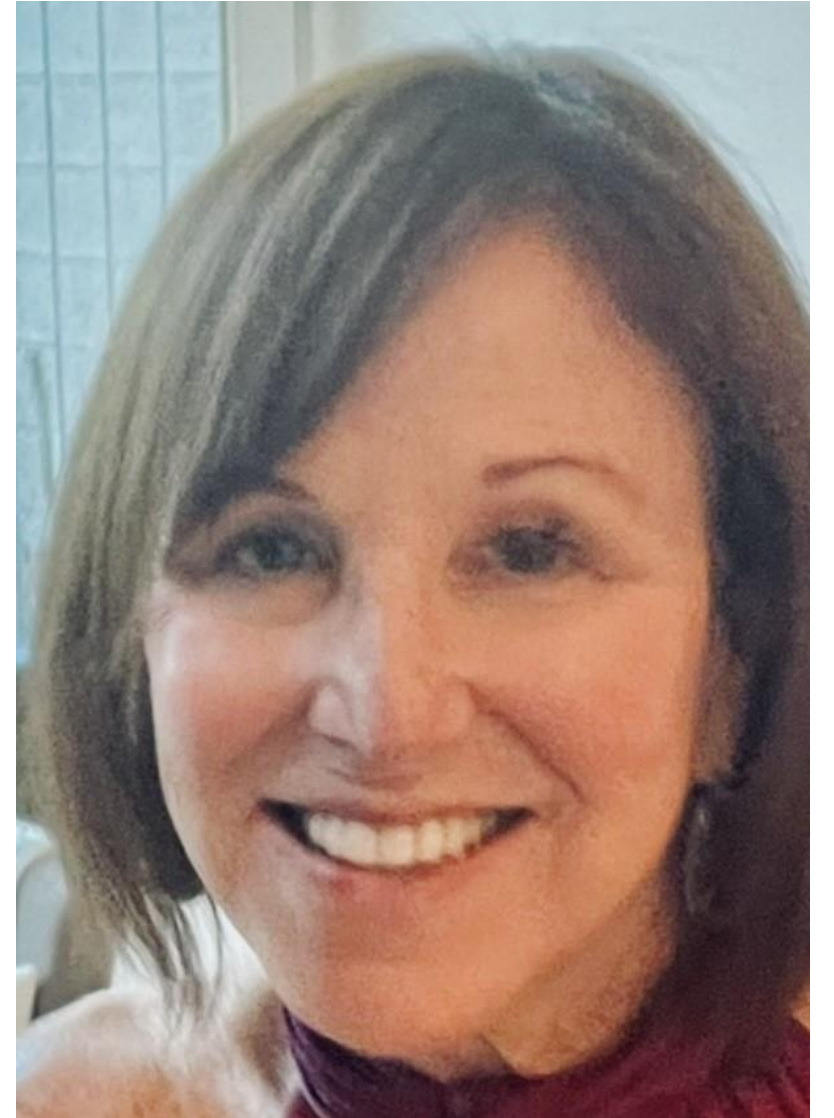

If we're honest, we know that there is a pedagogy gap (Sims, et al., 2020) in community college education. This is not an indictment of faculty. Rather, it is an indictment of an educational system that does not require coursework on teaching and learning (i.e., pedagogy) for the majority of educators in its employ. Nevertheless, there are ways to bridge this gap. In this tripartite PD experience, we will wrestle, both individually and collectively, with educational/pedagogical concepts/theories that center justice. The overarching goal of this series is to create space for educators—irrespective of prior experience—to arrive at an understanding of pedagogy as a tool not just for criticality and liberation, but also as a tool that forges radical inclusivity.
