


Reminders



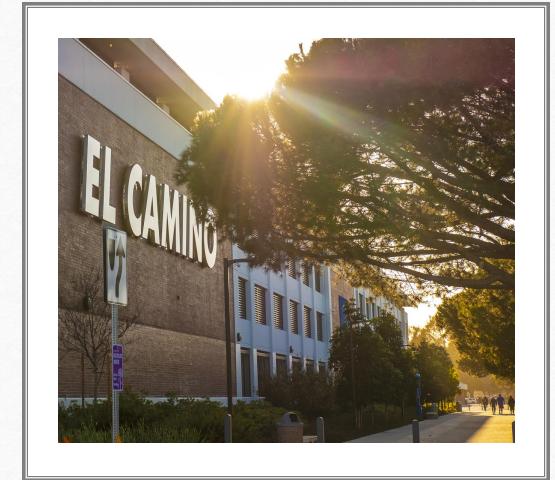

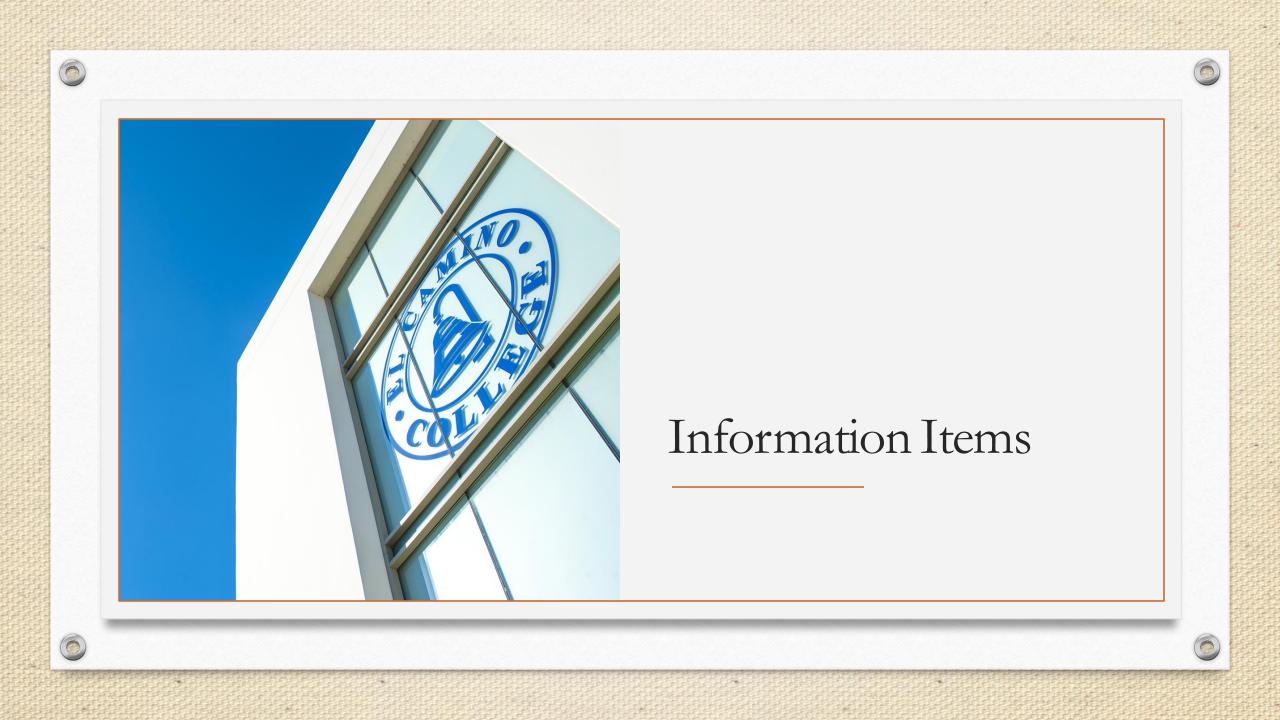

QR Phishing Scam ("QPhishing/Quishing") Stephanie Burnham

- What is a QR code again?
 - Legitimate QR code vs. a malicious one
 - Unable to tell a scammer QR code just by looking at the code itself!











QR Phishing Scam ("QPhishing") cont.

Malicious QR codes:

- appear legitimate; mimics official websites or services.
- may redirect to a phishing website, install malware, or prompt users to enter personal information.

How can you tell?

- Look for context clues!
- If in an email, check the sender; notice if there is a sense of urgency. Same for if it's in a text.
- If on a poster or flyer, check if it is a sticker/not part of the original flyer





Malicious QR Code Attack

×


Restaurant displays a QR code for customers to access their menu



Cybercriminal creates a malicious QR code & pastes it over the original



Customer scans fake QR code not realizing it's been tampered with



Customer enters credit card info thinking they're paying the restaurant bill

QR Phishing Scam ("QPhishing"): Other factors to consider

Look

• Look for malicious QR codes at shops and restaurants

Don't scar

• If it looks like the QR code was placed after the fact, don't scan it!

Ask

• Ask the employees for the specific code to scan





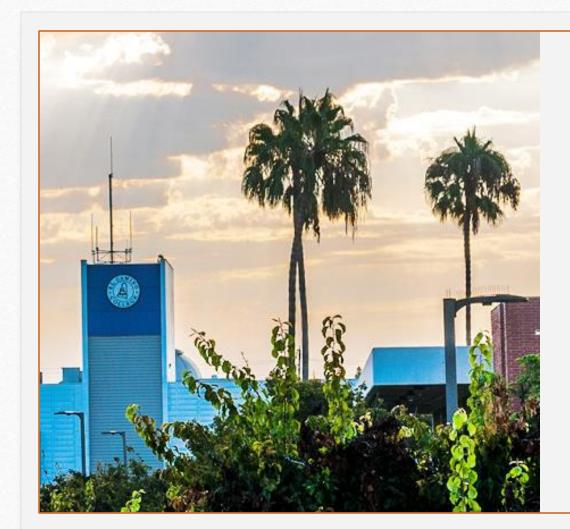


