The students will apply and evaluate the impact of the nursing process when researching care of the patient with biophysical health conditions under the four domains of patient, professional nursing, health and illness and the healthcare environment. Specific emphasis will be placed on application of the nursing process, critical thinking, therapeutic communication, academic writing, cultural, development, and diversity.

SLO #2 Role of Nurse Communication in Patient Care The student will identify the importance of communication for the registered nursing (RN) in the acute care setting by interviewing an RN. SLO #3 Term/Research Paper Working within a group the student will research a current health condition/issue considering the patient attributes impacting the condition such as age, gender, culture/ethnicity, occupation/education, relationships, spiritual/religious beliefs, and other health issues. The group will also consider how health care disparities and other social factors impact prevention and treatment of the disease process. The implementation of the nurse's role in caring for the patient will be included.
Course Objectives:	 Identify the nurse's role and responsibilities in communication with patient's across the lifespan while considering the patient's attributes, culture, family, and personal preferences. Discuss the importance of knowlege, skills, and attitudes as it relates to safety particularly considering critical thinking with the application drug dosage skills. Demonstrate critical thinking using basic statistical analysis to review nursing research articles and to write APA style papers. Evaluate how the evidence-based practice impacts biophysical outcomes in diverse patient populations. Discuss the use of nursing process in the development of a nursing care plan. Utilize standards of critical thinking to determine adequacy of data collection for the development of a nursing care plan. Differentiate between the novice nurse and expert nurse in the provision of nursing care in the hospital and community setting. Discuss the impact of legal and ethical concepts on the care of the hospitalized patient.

As a group effort, write an APA formatted ten- to twenty-page page paper based on your research that includes: an evaluation of the physiological changes caused by this condition and it's biopsychsocial impact Research and discuss how patient attributes such as development and functional ability impact family dynamics and how they effect the condition outcomes. Consider if healthcare disparities impact this health condition and suggest strategies to reconcile these discrepancies.
