Student Learning Outcomes:	Upon completion of Spanish 1, successful students will converse in and comprehend Spanish using present tense, simple past tense, and "ir + a + infinitive" construction about everyday topics, such as introductions and descriptions about themselves and others within the limits of vocabulary appropriate to beginning Spanish 1. SLO #2 Upon completion of Spanish 1, successful students will read and comprehend short paragraphs in Spanish on topics such as places in the city, daily routines, fields of study, pastimes, vacations, and likes and dislikes. SLO #3 Upon completion of Spanish 1, successful students will write a 5 to 10 sentence paragraph in Spanish about themselves and everyday topics such as leisurely activities and academic life using the present tense, simple past tense, and "ir + a + infinitive" construction.
Course Objectives:	 Read and write simple sentences in Spanish. Comprehend spoken Spanish at an elementary level and converse about everyday topics. Identify, examine, and discuss socially appropriate behavioral patterns and perspectives within the context of Spanish-speaking cultures. Compose short paragraphs in Spanish about everyday topics, about themselves, and about their friends and family. Write and speak elementary Spanish with culturally appropriate language structure and awareness of Hispanic social structure, manners, and idiomatic expressions. Write short correspondences (emails, social media posts) to Spanish speaking contacts using correct spelling and culturally appropriate languages. Compare idiomatic usage of the Spanish and English languages.
