


EOPS LEGACY

Above and Beyond Services 1969-2019

Extended Opportunity Programs & Services (EOPS) at El Camino College is dedicated to the delivery of a comprehensive program that encourages the enrollment, retention, and transfer of students who are challenged by language, social, economic, and educational disadvantages.

4 Brown V. Board of Education- Supreme Court ruled that "separate, but equal" was unconstitutional.
8. Rosa Parks arrested- for refusing to give up her seat on a Montgomery city bus.
7 "Little Rock Nine" - Federal troops were deployed to Little Rock Central H.S. to safely escort black students.
3 "The Birmingham Campaign"- Peaceful and non- violent protests against segregation laws in the city were met with violent attacks and arrest by Birmingham police.
March on Washington- 250,000 take part in the March for Jobs and Freedom. Martin Luther King gives the iconic "I have a Dream" speech in front of the Lincoln Memorial.
4 Civil Rights Act of 1964- signed into law by President Lyndon Johnson. It outlawed discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex, or national origin.
5 Selma to Montgomery March- Around 600 civil rights marchers walked from Selma, Alabama to Montgomery—the state's capital—to protest black voter suppression.

EOPS established-Senate Bill 164 was passed, which

authorized California Community Colleges to develop the EOPS program for the purpose of supporting economically and educationally disadvantaged students.


Library Services Platform (LSP) change:




Music Library browsing

- -The Music Library used to be completely closed stacks.
- -New browsing policy allows students to enter the closed stack area and browse titles. Many unique and historical items are being discovered this way!



New quiet and collaborative designated spaces

- -Quiet areas now have furniture that encourages solo-study. Our most recent survey told us that students prize quieter areas and requested the staff's help in maintaining calm.
- -Collaboration areas have open tables and group computer stations to encourage talking and sharing.



Among many other duties, the librarians run the **Embedded Librarian Program,** where librarians are paired with classroom faculty to co-teach research skills.


Students benefit from faculty partnerships and from extended time with librarians. The program is in its seventh year and is growing rapidly!
