- "The Board will *normally accept the recommendation* of the Academic Senate on academic and professional matters... If the district Governing Board of Trustees disagrees with the recommendation of the Academic Senate, representatives of the two bodies shall have the obligation to meet and reach *mutual agreement*..." (ECC Board Policy 2510).

A copy of the final negotiating package adopted by the Federation's Executive Committee shall be provided to the President of the Academic Senate.
- xecutive Committees of the Senate and Federation shall meet jointly at least series for discuss matters of mutual interest and concern.
- It is the intent of the parties that changes to this Agreement shall be arrived at through a process of collaborative discussions. Modifications shall be subject to the approva of the Academic Senate Council and the Federation's Executive Committee.




How long is the term for a senator on the ECC Academic Senate? (p. 4)



b. El Camino College District Budget: 2017-18 --

Josh Troesh. Two key issues to highlight regarding the budget: 1)
We are in the first year of stabilization and 2) \$15 million was
transferred to a fund earmarked for future STRS/PERS obligations.
The college is taking a proactive approach in preparing for STRS/PERS
liabilities. Despite projected shortfalls, there are many back stops in
place to ensure retirement funding will be available. Funding for TAs
and technicians is included in the budget; the college has indicated
strong support for student services. Fund 16 is not "locked up" but it's
clear from the establishment of the account that the intent is to use the
funds for STRS/PERS shortfalls.

d. ASO Vice President, Academic Affairs

Bryant Odega

Mr. Odega is a Political Science major, planning to attend law school and possibly run for office. He highlighted three ASO initiatives: the Metro U-Pass, the Warrior Pantry, and the Flow Water system. Students are eligible for the U-Pass bus transit pass if they are enrolled in 6 units and qualify for the BOG fee waiver. Passes are available in the bookstore and ASO funded 50% of the costs for the first 50 students to enroll, an incentive they plan to continue in the spring semester. The Warrior Pantry expects a soft opening in October. Mr. Odega noted that the response has been positive but that food and financial donations are still needed. Senators applauded the ASO initiative to install Flow Water systems on campus. ASO will be working on maintenance of the systems this year.

AB540 and Undocumented Student Resources

If you are a student who identifies as undocumented or AB 540 and are pursuing a college education, this page can help you understand how to access and request financial aid at El Camino College, locate scholarships, university grants and outside resources. Dream on!



What is AB 540?

AB 540 is a law that provides in-state tuition benefits for undocumented and out-of-state students who attend or will attend a public university in California. To qualify for AB 540 status, students must meet the following eligibility requirements:

- 1. Student must have attended a high school (public or private) in California for three or more years
- 2. Student must have graduated from a California high school or attained the equivalent (GED or CA HS Proficiency exam)
- 3. Student must be enrolled in an accredited California Institution of Higher Education
- 4. Student must file a <u>California Nonresident Tuition Exemption Form</u> that includes an affidavit stating they have filed (or will file) an application to legalize as soon as they are able to do so. Completed forms must be submitted to the Admissions and Records Office located in the Student Services Center.
- Submit a copy of your high school diploma and sealed high school transcripts to the El Camino College Admissions office for verification.







ILO Assessment

The Critical Thinking ILO assessment took place during Spring 2016. Faculty used a common rubric to rate their students' critical thinking skills. In all, 68.5% of 1,422 students passed the assessment. Assessing Student Learning Outcomes

Tips for submitting timely and complete SLO/PLO assessments

- ✓ Start planning early for PLO assessments to permit sufficient time to develop any surveys or to complete related course-level assessments
- ✓ Consider program-level collaboration among instructors of the same course to identify "signature assessments" to facilitate trend analysis
- Be thoughtful when identifying action items for SLO/PLO assessments for which the performance standard has been met (e.g., expand scope of current outcome statement: review/revise the instructional materials designed to facilitate student achievement
- ✓ Collaborate with program colleagues to implement specific SLO/PLO action items and to ensure followup in subsequent terms accordingly


