This course is a survey of the history of California with an emphasis on the geographical, political, socio-economic and cultural development of the state. The role of ethnic minorities and women from pre-European times to the present will also be discussed.

- 1. Identify and describe the major geographical features of California and how they impacted the State's development.

- 5. Identify and assess the contributions of major historical figures to California history.

- 6. Describe significant social, economic, and cultural developments in California history.

- 1. Developing and Arguing a Persuasive Historical Thesis
 - Students will develop and persuasively argue a historical thesis in a written assignment that identifies and explains major social, economic, political and/or cultural themes or patterns in the history of California.
- 2. Applying Historical Methods to Source Analysis
 - Students will apply appropriate historical methods to analyze and use primary and/or secondary sources as evidence to support the thesis in an essay addressing issues in the history of California.
