#### **CAREER OPPORTUNITIES**

Business Administration programs are designed to prepare people to plan, organize, and control the activities of people and other resources to achieve the objectives of an organization. Typical options under Business Administration major include: Accounting, Finance, Management, Human Resources Management, International Business, Management Information Systems, Operations Management (or Management Science), Marketing, and Business Law, Real Estate and Labor Relations, Transportation and Logistics. Not every college offers all of these options; check with the transfer college catalog or web site of your choice.

#### **BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AS-T, 2.0**

\*Required by new students who began college **fall 2022** or thereafter. Students who started prior to summer or fall 2022 and maintained continuous attendance are recommended to follow 2.0 for transfer admission benefits. Continuous attendance is defined as enrolled and received a letter grade, W, P/NP in at least one semester in an academic year.

<u>**Pre-Major Courses</u>**: English 1A (ENGL C1000 or ENGL C1000H), 1B or 1C (ENGL C1001 or ENGL C1001H) or Phil 105; Math 165 or 190; Recommended: Business 150-151 (completion of 150-151 will remove one required BUAD course at USC)</u>

\* Note: Students should complete the following pre-major requirements by the end of the fall semester prior to the application deadline (February 15<sup>th</sup>) to be a competitive applicant: English 1B or 1C (ENGL C1001 or ENGL C1001H); Math 165 or Math 190.

A maximum of 64 units can be transferred from a community college. Students should have 30 transferable units of transferable course work by the end of the spring semester prior to fall transfer. Admission is competitive; students with an average GPA of 3.70 or higher and grades of "B" or better in the courses required for admission will have an advantage in the admissions review process.

A lower division business law class is required after transfer. A student must have completed a course in Business Calculus, with a grade of "B" or better to transfer into the College of Business Administration.

Students should follow the LMU general education requirements and complete as many of the Business Administration requirements listed above. In most cases, students are eligible to transfer after completing 30 units of transferable coursework, with a minimum GPA of 3.00. A maximum of 60 units may be transferred from all community college work.

## **B.A. Business Administration**

Junior level applicants with the highest grades overall and who satisfactorily complete required lower-division major requirements will be given preference for admission. Minimum grade of 3.0

**Required courses**: Math 190 and 191, Economics 101, 102; Math 150 (\*Stat C1000 or C1000H), or Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A; Business 150, 151; BUS 101

Business Information Management: B grades or better are required in all courses: add CSCI 1 & 30; Math 210, 270, CSCI 3

#### **UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, RIVERSIDE**

Completion of IGETC is required. Minimum UC cumulative GPA of 2.7 required and minimum GPA of 2.5 required in major preparation courses.

**Required Courses:** Business 101; Business 150; Economics 101, 102; Math 165 or 190, and Math 150 (\*Stat C1000 or C1000H). Other prerequisites must be taken at UCR.

NOTE: Students who take Business 151 will receive subject credit for UCR's Business 108 which is an upper division course at UCR. Students will have to take additional upper division units for the degree.

#### **UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY**

Major Prerequisite Courses: Business 101; Economics 101, 102; English 1A (\*Eng1 C1000 or C1000H) and 1B; Math 150 (\*Stat C1000 or C1000H); Math 190 and 191;

To be eligible for admission to the Haas School of Business a student must:

- 1. Complete all prerequisite courses with letter grades of C- higher no more than five years before starting at UCB. If you plan to begin Haas in Fall 2025, prerequisites taken before Fall 2020 must be repeated.
- 2. Complete 60 UC transferable semester units.
- 3. Items 1 and 2 must be completed by the end of the spring term prior to fall enrollment. Note: Only applicants who have completed 100% of the prerequisites will be considered for admission. Failure to complete these prerequisites is the primary reason for denial of applications.
- 4. Students must meet the breadth requirement through course work. AP, A level, or IB exams will not fulfill breadth requirements. IGETC does not meet breadth requirements.
