#### CAREER OPPORTUNITIES

Business Administration programs are designed to prepare people to plan, organize, and control the activities of people and other resources to achieve the objectives of an organization. Typical options under Business Administration major include: Accounting, Finance, Management, Human Resources Management, International Business, Management Information Systems, Operations Management (or Management Science), Marketing, and Business Law, Real Estate and Labor Relations, Transportation and Logistics. Not every college offers all of these options; check with the transfer college catalog or web site of your choice.

#### **BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION AS-T, 2.0**

\*Required by new students who began college summer/fall 2022 or thereafter. Students who started prior to summer/ fall 2022 and maintained continuous attendance should follow Business Administration 1.0. Continuous attendance is defined as enrolled and received a letter grade, W, P/NP in at least one semester in an academic year.

**<u>Required Pre-Major Courses</u>**: Economics 101\*and 102\*; Math 165\* or Math 190\*; Business 150-151. Highly recommended: CIS 13; Math 140 or 150, US History/Political Science graduation requirement. Admission is based on the cumulative GPA, completion of supplemental requirements, and space available basis.

## CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, NORTHRIDGE

**Options**: Business Law, Global Supply Chain Management, Real Estate, and Systems Operation Management. Separate degrees are available in finance, marketing, and management.

**<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>**: Business 150-151, 108, CIS 13; Economics 101, 102; Law 4 or 5; Math 150 **and** Math 165 or 190. A cumulative GPA of 2.5 will be required for the financial service option for admission.

Finance Degree: no additional courses

Marketing Degree: no additional courses

Accounting Option: Students must complete Business 150 and Business 108 with grades of "B" or better. The other prerequisite courses need to be completed with grades of "C" or better.

Note: The following four impacted <u>business majors</u> admit applicants to the **pre-major** program based on their GPA\*: Accountancy, Finance/Financial Analysis, Finance/Financial Planning, and Finance/Insurance.

## SAN DIEGO STATE UNIVERSITY \*Impacted

**Pre-Major Courses**: Business 150-151; & 108 (Business 108 is not required for accounting majors.); CIS 13; Economics 101, 102; Law 4; Math 150 or Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A; Math 140 **and** Math 165 or 190. **NOTES**:

Students must apply to enter the University under the business administration pre-major. To be admitted to the upper division emphasis, students must meet the following criteria:

- 1) Grades of C or better required in each pre-major class;
- 2) Complete a minimum of 60 transferable semester units;
- 3) Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.90;
- 4) Complete all lower division GE by the spring semester prior to transfer.

International Business: requires two semesters of a foreign language.

## CALIFORNIA POLYTECHNIC STATE UNIVERSITY, SAN LUIS OBISPO \*Impacted

**<u>Pre-Major Courses</u>**: Business 150-151; Economics 101, 102; Law 5; Math 150 and 165 or 190 <u>NOTE</u>: The Economic major is also offered in the School of Business with options in Business and Industrial Economics, International Trade and Development, and Quantitative Economics.

## CALIFORNIA STATE UNIVERSITY, SAN JOSE \*Impacted

Pre-Major Courses: Business 150; Economics 101\*, 102\*; CIS 13; Law 4 or 5; English 1B or 1C or Philosophy 105 or Psychology 103; Math 150\* and 165 or 190.

Note: The following concentrations must also take Business 150: Business Analytics, Entrepreneurship, Finance, General Business, Global Operations Management, Human Resources Management, International Business, Management, Management Information Systems, and Marketing.

# CALIFORNIA POLYTECHNIC STATE UNIVERSITY, POMONA

OPTIONS IN ACCOUNTING; CIS; E-BUSINESS; FINANCE, REAL ESTATE AND LAW; INTERNATIONAL BUSINESS; MANAGEMENT AND HUMAN RESOURCES; MARKETING MANAGEMENT; AND TECHNOLOGY AND OPERATIONS MANAGEMENT

**Pre-Major Courses**: Business 150-151; Economics 101 & 102; English 1C; Math 150 and Math 165 or Math 190; CIS 13; Law 4

Note: Marketing Management: add Psychology 101

## UNIVERSITY OF SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA, (USC)

**Pre-Major Courses**: English 1A, 1B or 1C; Math 165 or 190; Recommended: Business 150-151 (completion of 150-151 will remove one required BUAD course at USC)

\* Note: Students should complete the following pre-major requirements by the end of the fall semester prior to the application deadline (February 1) to be a competitive applicant: English 1B or 1C; Math 165 or Math 190.

A maximum of 64 units can be transferred from a community college. Students should have 30 transferable units of transferable course work by the end of the spring semester prior to fall transfer. Admission is competitive; students with an average GPA of 3.70 or higher and grades of "B" or better in the courses required for admission will have an advantage in the admissions review process.

## LOYOLA MARYMOUNT UNIVERSITY

Pre-Major Courses: Business 150-151; Economics 101, 102; Math 165 or Math 190; Psychology 101; Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A; Law 4

A lower division business law class is required after transfer. A student must have completed a course in Business Calculus, with a grade of "B" or better to transfer into the College of Business Administration.

Students should follow the LMU general education requirements and complete as many of the Business Administration requirements listed above. In most cases, students are eligible to transfer after completing 30 units of transferable coursework, with a minimum GPA of 3.00. A maximum of 60 units may be transferred from all community college work.

## PEPPERDINE UNIVERSITY, SEAVER COLLEGE

Before official acceptance into the Business Administration Division, students will be classified as pre-accounting, prebusiness, or pre-international business majors. Students may apply for full admission to the division after completion of at least 48 units with a minimum 2.50 GPA both overall and in the major

## **B.A. Business Administration**

Junior level applicants with the highest grades overall and who satisfactorily complete required lower-division major requirements will be given preference for admission. Minimum grade of 3.0

**Required courses**: Math 150 or Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A; Business 150, 151; Economics 101, 102; Math 190 and 191

Business Information Management: B grades or better are required in all courses: add CS 2, 3, 30; Math 210, 270

## UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, RIVERSIDE

Completion of IGETC is required. Minimum UC cumulative GPA of 2.7 required and minimum GPA of 2.5 required in major preparation courses.

**Required Courses:** Economics 101, 102; CIS 13; Business 101; Business 150; Math 150; Math 165 or 190. Other prerequisites must be taken at UCR.

NOTE: Students who take Business 151 will receive subject credit for UCR's Business 108 which is an upper division course at UCR. Students will have to take additional upper division units for the degree.

# UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, BERKELEY

Major Prerequisite Courses: Business 101; Economics 101, 102; English 1A and 1B; Math 150; Math 190 and 191;

To be eligible for admission to the Haas School of Business a student must:

- 1. Complete all prerequisite courses with letter grades of C- higher no more than five years before starting at UCB.
- 2. Complete 60 UC transferable semester units.
- 3. Items 1 and 2 must be completed by the end of the spring term prior to fall enrollment. Note: Only applicants who have completed 100% of the prerequisites will be considered for admission. Failure to complete these prerequisites is the primary reason for denial of applications.
- 4. Students must meet the breadth requirement through course work. AP, A level, or IB exams will not fulfill breadth requirements. IGETC does not meet breadth requirements.

<u>Note</u>: Apply October 1-November 30 for admission for the following Fall semester. The completed application must be postmarked no later than November 30. For important information, please refer to the website: www.haas.berkeley.edu/Undergrad/

## **UC Berkeley Breath Requirements**
