ASSOCIATE DEGREE REQUIREMENTS

<u>Notes</u>: Graduates will have experience in all areas of the apparel chain, including product development, production, wholesale sales, distribution, retail buying, selling, and promotion. Through a combination of coursework and internship experience, graduates will be prepared for supervisory, managerial and executive level career paths. Students will also have the opportunity to learn in the Apparel Technology and Research Center, the only facility of its kind on the West Coast. This state-of-the-art manufacturing facility will provide students with first-hand knowledge of the apparel manufacturing process.

FASHION INSTITUTE OF DESIGN AND MERCHANDISING (FIDM) (2020-2021)

FIDM offers a variety of Associate's and Bachelor's or Advanced Study Programs in design and creative business fields; They welcome transfer students with a wide range of credits and college experiences for their undergraduate programs.

<u>Transferring with fewer than 45 college credits</u>: If you have attended an accredited 2-year or 4-year college, up to 30 semester units (45 quarter units) may be transferable into one of FIDM's Associate of Arts programs that also lead to their Bachelor's degrees.

Application Deadlines

New students may enter in the quarters starting in July, October, January, or April. FIDM accept students year round as class space allows.

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OTIS COLLEGE OF ART AND DESIGN (2020-2021)

Otis College of Art and Design welcomes transfer students who would like to complete their studies to earn a BFA degree. About 30% of new students are transfer students and they thrive in the creative community at Otis. Transfer students are encouraged to be in touch with Admissions to discuss transfer pathways, course selections to maximize transfer credits and developing a strong portfolio.

Major: Fashion Design with an Emphasis in Costume Design

To enter as a sophomore, it is recommended that you have:

- o 17 semester units of studio art from a regionally accredited institution
- 6-12 semester units of general education are recommended:
 - English Composition (often the first college-level English course at most universities)
 - Art History Survey course covering Prehistoric to Gothic periods
 - Art History Survey course covering Renaissance to Modern periods
 - Social Science (such as a Psychology, Sociology, or Political Science course)
- A portfolio that demonstrates you are able to bypass the Foundation year

Note: Fashion Design majors are not accepted as Junior level transfer.

Application Deadlines

Otis College accepts undergraduate applications for the fall and spring semesters. Admission is rolling after the priority deadline as space remains available.

Fall Semester Entry: Students can enter into the Foundation, Sophomore, Junior level Application Opens: August 1st Early Action Deadline: December 1st

<u>Spring Semester Entry:</u> Application Opens: August 1st Priority Deadline: November 1st (with Rolling admission after)

A maximum of 63 transfer credits can be awarded to undergraduate applicants.
