



# Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)

University of California and California State University 2024-2025

Students beginning or returning to a CCC after breaking enrollment in Fall 2025 or later will be required to follow the upcoming California General Education Transfer Curriculum (CalGETC) requirements. The 2024-2025 academic year will be the final catalog year to use the IGETC/CSU GE pattern.

IGETC is a general education pattern that will meet lower-division general education requirements at most California State University (CSU) or University of California (UC) campuses. Completion of the IGETC is not a requirement for admission to the CSU or UC (UCB requires IGETC or the L&S Requirements in Reading & Composition, Quantitative Reasoning, and Foreign Language for majors in the College of Letters and Sciences; UCR requires IGETC for the Business Administration major), nor will its completion guarantee admission to a CSU or UC campus. The IGETC pattern is not the only way to fulfill lower-division general education requirements. Depending on the major or field of interest, it may be advantageous to fulfill the general education breadth of the specific CSU or UC campus. **Information is subject to change and does not replace an educational plan completed with a counselor.**

**UC transfer minimum eligibility for admission:** 1) Complete 60 UC transferable units, 2) Earn a minimum GPA of 2.4 (many UC campuses require a higher GPA to be competitive, consult with a counselor for details), 3) Complete a specific pattern of courses (7-course pattern): two transferable English composition courses (UC-E), one transferable math course (UC-M), and four courses from two different areas in Arts and Humanities, Social and Behavioral Sciences, and Physical and Biological Sciences.

**Please consult with a counselor to determine whether IGETC is appropriate for your major and educational goals.**

**General rules for using IGETC:**

- Each course must have been IGETC approved at the time it was taken. See [www.assist.org](http://www.assist.org) for a list of certified courses and approval dates.
- All courses must be passed with a "C" or higher. A "P" (Pass) is acceptable, UC allows no more than 14 transferable semester units to be completed on a pass/no pass basis. P=C or better. C- is not acceptable.
- Community college courses have limitations on the amount of credit awarded. See a counselor for details and page 3 of this document.
- International records will not be used toward IGETC.

- Course work (transcripts) from other regionally accredited universities and colleges needs to be on file at ECC.

#### Area 4 Social and Behavioral Sciences

A minimum of 6 semester or 9 quarter units must be distributed as follows: Two courses from at least two different groups/disciplines. Students that started a CCC prior to Fall 2023 and maintained continuous attendance must have 9 semester/12 quarter units from at least two disciplines. Continuous attendance is defined as enrolled and received a letter grade, W, P/NP in at least one semester in an academic year.

#### Area 5 Physical and Biological Sciences

Two courses and a minimum of 7–9 semester or 9-12 quarter units required; one course from 5A and one course from 5B. One must include a laboratory from 5C; the laboratory course must correspond to a lecture course in 5A or 5B (i.e. Anthropology 1 and 5) **Underlined courses include laboratory, if the course is a one-unit lab; you must take the corresponding lecture course.**

#### Area 6 Languages other than English (LOTE) UC Requirement Only)

- A course at ECC: Chinese 1, French 1, German 1, Italian 1, Japanese 1, Sign Language 111□, Spanish 1, 1H, 52A, 52B.
- Two years of high school coursework in a language other than English with a final grade of C or better. The two years must be in the same language (high school transcripts must be on file with ECC).
- Foreign language course (or courses) at another college or university that is comparable to two years of high school foreign language.
- Satisfactory score on the SAT II: Subject Test in languages other than English. (if taken before May 1995, use the first score; if taken after May 1995, use the second score): Chinese with Listening 500/520; French/French with Listening 500/540; German/German with Listening 500/510; Hebrew (modern) 500/470; Italian 500/520; Japanese with Listening 500/510; Korean /500; Latin 500/530; Spanish/ Spanish with Listening 500/520
- Score of 3 or better on the College Board Advanced Placement Examinations in languages other than English.
- Score of 5 or higher on the International Baccalaureate Higher Level Examinations in languages other than English.
- Satisfactory completion of an achievement or proficiency test administered by a community college, university or other college in a language other than English. The test must assess the student proficiency at a level equivalent to at least two years of high school language. This conclusion must be posted on a transcript indicating unit, course title, and grade or on a document with letter head of the institution granting proficiency stating that the student has mastered proficiency in the language equivalent to two years of high school language.
- Language other than English "O" level exam with a grade of A, B, or C.
- Language other than English International "A" level exam with a score of 5, 6, 7.
- Satisfactory completion of C grades or better, of two years of formal schooling at the sixth-grade level or higher in an institution where the language of instruction is not English. Note: If the secondary school was completed in a non-English speaking country and the language of instruction of the secondary school was not English, language other than English proficiency can be certified for IGETC without further evaluation. The student must present appropriate documentation of attendance at the secondary school.
- A Defense Language Institute language other than English course which is indicated as passed with a "C" or higher on the official transcript.

**Area 7 Ethnic Studies** One course taken fall 2023 or after. These courses may be listed in more than one area but can only be used in Area 4 or 7 not both. Course is required for students who begin at ECC (or any CCC) Fall 2023 or after.

**California State University (CSU) Graduation Requirement:** Courses in U. S. History, Constitution and American Ideals are required for graduation by the CSU. Although the U. S. History, Constitution and American Ideals requirement is not part of the IGETC pattern, students who plan to transfer to the CSU are encouraged to complete the requirement prior to transfer to satisfy CSU graduation requirements. This requirement can be satisfied by completing any combination of two classes that, when combined, fulfill US-1, US-2 and US-3. **These courses may be used to partially satisfy the Area 3B or 4 requirements.**

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**UC Credit Limitations:** Every California Community College has a Transfer Course Agreement (TCA) with the University of California that specifies how many units of credit will be granted by the UC. Students should pay special attention to courses and units granted when applying the units to meet the 60 units for admission. Below are the credit limitations for El Camino College courses.

**Anatomy 30** No credit for 30 if taken after Anatomy 32 or Physiology 31

**Architecture 199** maximum credit, one course; course was not approved prior to F00 by UC

**Art 142** (formerly was repeatable 142abcd, maximum credit is 3 units)

**Astronomy 20 or 20H or 25 or 25H and 12;** Astronomy 12 must be taken after or concurrently with 20 or 20H or 25 or 25H to receive transfer credit

**Education 101 and 201;** maximum credit is one course

**English as a Second Language (ESL) 53B, 53C** ESL courses combined, maximum of 8 units

**Geology 30, 32, 34, 36** combined: maximum credit, one course

**Human Development 110, 110H and 115** combined, maximum credit, one course

**Journalism 12 and Communication Studies 265** (formerly 5) combined: maximum credit, one course

**Math 110, 111, 115, and 116** combined: maximum credit, one course

**Math 130 and 180** combined: maximum credit, one course

**Math 115, Math 150, 150H, Psychology 109A (formerly 9A), and Sociology 109A** combined: maximum credit, one course

**Math 180** maximum credit 4 units (if taken before fall 2006, if taken fall 2006 or thereafter, students will receive 5 units for the course)

**Math 160, 165, 190:** maximum credit, one course (student takes Math 165 and then takes Math 190, the student will receive UC transfer unit credit for one course)

**PE Activity-** maximum of four units transfer to the UC; **PE 217--** Any theory course: maximum credit 8 units

**Physical Science 25** no credit if taken after a college level physics or chemistry course

**Physics 1ABCD and 2AB and 3AB** combined maximum credit, one series/one course (student takes Physics 2A and then takes Physics 1A, student will receive credit for one course); **Physics 11, 12,** no credit if taken after 1A or 2A

**Psychology 109 (formerly 9A), Sociology 109A, Math 115, Math 150, 150H** combined: maximum credit, one course

**Spanish 1 and 52A and 52B**, no credit for Spanish 1 if taken after 52A or 52B

**Advanced Placement Examinations (AP):** A score of 3, 4, or 5 is required for IGETC certification. An acceptable score of 3, 4, or 5 for IGETC equates to either 3 semester or 4 quarter units for certification purposes. Each AP exam may be applied to one IGETC area as satisfying one course requirement. \*Note: Students must check the transfer institution's college catalog or website for units awarded toward the minimum 60 units required for admission and credit toward major preparation.

**International Baccalaureate Exams (IB)**

A score of 5, 6 or 7 on Higher Level (HL) exams is required for IGETC certification. An acceptable IB score for IGETC equates to either 3 semester or 4 quarter units for certification purposes. Students who have earned credit from an IB exam should not take a comparable college course because transfer credit will not be granted for both. \*IB exams may be used in either area regardless of where the certifying CCC's discipline is located.
