A. <u>AB 2910 - QUARTERLY FISCAL STATUS REPORT</u>

It is recommended that the Board of Trustees receive the following Quarterly Financial Status Report for the quarter ending March 31, 2005.

AB 2910, Chapter 1486, Statutes of 1986, requires that California community college districts report quarterly on their financial condition.

Starting with the quarter ending September 30, 1987, and quarterly thereafter, districts are required to prepare a Quarterly Financial Status Report, certified for accuracy by the district chief executive officer and chief business officer, and present this report to the governing board. The report is to be reviewed by the District governing board at a regularly scheduled meeting and entered into the minutes of the meeting. Within five working days following the governing board meeting, the fiscal year status report and a copy of a report of the district's financial condition are to be submitted to the Chancellor's Office and the County Superintendent of Schools. The quarterly reports will be reviewed and districts will be notified if further action is necessary.

The report for March 31, 2005, is shown on the following Quarterly Financial Status Report.

B. TENTATIVE BUDGET 2005–2006

It is recommended that the Tentative Budgets, including the General Fund-Unrestricted, General Fund-Restricted, Student Financial Aid, Child Development, Capital Outlay, General Obligation Bond, Workers' Compensation, Property and Liability Self-Insurance, Dental Self-Insurance, Bookstore, and Special Reserve Fund-Retiree Health Premiums Funds for the 2005–06 fiscal year be submitted to the Board for adoption at the June 20, 2005, meeting. California Code Regulations Section 58305(a) requires that, on or before the first day of July, each community college district shall file a tentative budget with the County Superintendent of Schools.

C. <u>APPROVAL TO DEPOSIT FUNDS WITH SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA COMMUNITY COLLEGE DISTRICTS' SELF-FUNDED INSURANCE AGENCY FOR WORKERS' COMPENSATION PROTECTION</u>

It is recommended that the Board approve payments not to exceed \$1,200,000 to Southern California Community College Districts' Self-Funded Insurance Agency for Workers' Compensation Protection for the payment of workers' compensation claims during the 2005-2006 budget year. A payment of \$500,000 is to be made July 1, 2005; the balance is to be made by October 1, 2005. This total amount is provided in the Workers' Compensation Fund for the 2005-2006 budget year.

D. <u>CHANCELLOR'S OFFICE TAX OFFSET PROGRAM</u>

It is recommended that the Board approve the participation of the District in the Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP). In this program, the unpaid fees of resident students and students paying out-of-state fees are submitted for collection under the contract with the COTOP.

E. TRANSFER OF FUNDS TO GENERAL FUND-RESTRICTED (12)

It is recommended that up to \$140,200 of monies in the 2004-05 General Fund-Unrestricted (11) be transferred to the General Fund-Restricted (12) to meet the 2004-05 requirements to match the State funds, \$1/District to \$3/State, received for library materials/instructional equipment/technology.

F. INTERNATIONAL STUDENT HEALTH INSURANCE

It is recommended that the Board approve an increase in the premium for international student health insurance. The International Student Program (ISP) requires all of its students to purchase health insurance from a carrier contracted by the District. There is no cost to the District. Scholastic Insurance Services, Inc. will continue as the contracted carrier for the District. The 2004-05 premium is \$264 for the Fall semester and \$264 for the Spring semester. Coverage extends through winter and summer. The 2005-06 premium will be \$288 per semester – a \$22 increase. The office visit fee will increase from \$20 to \$25 per visit. The rates are effective August 1, 2005.

G. <u>INFORMATION ITEM</u>

The District will enter into an agreement with Total Compensation Systems, Inc., to provide retiree health valuation services in preparation for the requirements of the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB), Statement No. 43 & Statement No. 45. The valuation and actuarial study will provide information to assess the fiscal impact of the requirements and also provide information necessary to satisfy accreditation reviews and to charge retiree health costs to categorical programs under California Community Colleges Accounting Advisory 96-2. The agreement for the period April 12, 2005, through June 30, 2005, is a guaranteed fee of \$6,000 for the initial study and an additional \$4,000 for extra services that may be requested by the District, not to exceed \$10,000.

H. BID 2004-12/FINANCIAL AID PLANNER

It is recommended that the Board approve award to Syndistar Inc. for services necessary to produce the 2005-06 Financial Aid Planners for the Financial Aid Department in accordance with the specifications, terms, and conditions of bid 2004-12/Financial Aid Planner. The period of service will be for one (1) year and may be extended for four (4) additional one-year periods if mutually agreed upon by the seller and the District. The total bid amount is \$50,750.56
