- a. Review minutes (October 2018). Dipte Patel did a motion to approve. Crystle Martin second. Minutes approved.
- b. Recording Meetings Thurman Brown is researching a new system that would allow more clear voice recordings of meetings in rooms such as these.
- c. Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Pete Marcoux has ordered six charging carts and has another four carts that he will order. Math has three or four carts. Do we use ChromeBooks for the areas on campus that do not need standard computers? One charging cart with thirty-six ChromeBooks runs about \$13,000. This would cut our cost by approximately one-quarter of the price for a standard laptop. These are all under warranty. Instead of using the kiosks for timekeeping, we could use ChromeBooks by uploading the software on the ChromeBook.

III. New Business

a. Data Governance/Data Dictionary Presentation. Vladimir Vasquez, co-Chair of subcommittee presented.

Data governance is the overall management of the availability, usability, integrity and security of data used with higher education principles. We are planning to have a very well structured Data Governance program that defines a set of procedures and execute more of that plan via data sharing on campus.
