- If you are a student, College Faculty and Administrators are required to report what you share with them.
- If you choose to report, El Camino College encourages reporting as soon as possible.
- If you decide to report, your information will only be shared with those who need to know.
- El Camino College is committed to acting promptly & appropriately to prevent and stop acts of retaliation toward anyone reporting.
- If needed, the Title IX Coordinator can arrange for services, accommodations and other assistance to be implemented to ensure a safe and supportive environment for you.
- If you do NOT want to report incidents to the College or law enforcement, you may speak with a Student Health Center Psychologist. They are the only confidential resource on campus, but there are many off-campus confidential options.
