Data Sources









Enrollment by Ethnicity








Enrollment by Gender


Enrollment – Gender by Ethnicity




ECC has an ACCJC Institution-Set Standard of 65% and an Institutional Effectiveness Outcome goal of 74% by the year 2019-2020.







Student Persistence Over Four Semesters Fall 2011 to Fall 2015







Employee Workforce Distribution














