SINGER PROFILES



MS. SOYUN KANG is a celebrated woman choral music director in the South Bay area. She is currently the conductor of the El Camino College Chorale and Concert Choir and also serves as a Music Director for private choir groups. Ms. Kang's career in choral music spans over 38 years, with such highlights as conductor for the El Camino College Women's Chorus and founder and artistic director of Heavenly Voices adult and children's choirs. Ms. Kang made her first Carnegie Hall conducting debut with the El Camino College Chorus on May 25, 2024. Ms. Kang pursued her passion for music

as an undergraduate at the University of California, Davis. She continued her studies at California State University, Long Beach, earning her Master of Music in Choral Conducting with the honor of most outstanding graduate from the College of Arts, and was elected to Phi Beta Delta Honor Society. She has studied under Albert J. McNeil, Jane Hardester, Lynn Bielefelt, Robert Page, and Charlene Archibeque. Ms. Kang has taught conducting, vocal techniques, and choirs of various levels at CSULB (1996-1999) and El Camino College (2004-2007). Following her passion for choral music, she founded the "Heavenly Voices Choir" for children in San Jose, CA, in 2010. Ms. Kang came to the United States from Korea at the age of 16 and currently resides in Torrance, CA. She delights in creating sounds that blend various cultures while featuring their unique voices. Ms. Kang treasures serving as a church choir conductor throughout California, including in the cities of Davis, Torrance, Anaheim, San Jose, and Brea, as the most cherished experience in life.



JEANNIE HEEJIN KANG's love for piano began when she was but the age of 6 and she soon found herself playing accompanist for her church at the age of 8. At 16, she immigrated to Brazil with her family where she went to Faculdade Santa Marcelina to study piano performance before moving to the United States when she was 20. In the US, Heejin studied at El Camino College before transferring to Biola University where she studied with her mentor, Professor Jenny Wong, and was eventually selected to study piano performance directly under Menahem Pressler. Heejin uses her

vast and varied experience and skill to teach the next generation, having taught piano for over 35 years. She has worked as accompanist for various churches and choirs, the most recent of which being Zion United Korean Methodist Church. She has also accompanied for Cerritos Presbyterian Chuch and the Joanna Medawar Naschef Singers, with whom she debuted at Carnegie Hall in 2024.
