PRODUCTION TEAM PROFILES



DR. DAVID MOYER is a professional saxophonist, arranger/composer, educator, and producer based in his hometown of Los Angeles, CA. He is currently Director of Jazz Studies, Instrumental Music, and Applied Music, and Assistant Professor of Music at El Camino College in Torrance, CA. He holds a Bachelor of Arts in Music Performance from UCLA, and earned his Master of Music and Doctor of Musical Arts degrees in Jazz Studies from the Thornton School of Music at USC.

Dr. Moyer maintains a dynamic career as a performing and recording musician, and has performed with Gerald Wilson, Anthony Wilson, Kamasi Washington, Terrace Martin, John Beasley's MONK'estra, Guru, Big Daddy Kane, DJ Premier, Dakah Hip Hop Orchestra, Tears For Fears, Sara Bareilles, and Father John Misty amongst others. Dr. Moyer has performed internationally at venues such as The Glastonbury Festival (UK), Coachella Music and Arts Festival (USA), The Istanbul Jazz Festival (Istanbul, Turkey), La Defense Jazz Festival (Paris, France), Billboard Live (Tokyo, Japan), the Walt Disney Concert Hall (Los Angeles, CA), The Hollywood Bowl, The BleauLive Theater (Las Vegas), and The Barbican Theatre (London, UK), and has performed on myriad television shows.

Dr. Moyer co-leads contemporary jazz quintet DD Horns along with trumpeter Danny T Levin. Their self-titled debut recording DD Horns was released independently in March, 2017 to critical acclaim. *DD Horns* released their follow up recording entitled *Cali Shine* on June 17th , 2022.

Dr. Moyer's robust sound, creative arrangements, and unique approach to work in the studio can be heard on recordings including Jimmy Cliff's Grammy winning record 'The Rebirth,' Snoop Dogg's 'Snoop Lion', Iggy Pop, Florence And The Machine arranged by Kamasi Washington, U2, Gary Clark Jr, Haim, Mavis Staples, Regina Spektor, and 21 Pilots, and on popular film/TV productions including scoring for Paramount and Warner Brothers Films & Netflix's "Outer Banks" among many more.

NATÁLIA SPADINI is a singer/songwriter based in Los Angeles since 2013. Native from São Paulo, Brazil, she started to work with music at the age of fourteen.

She has been part of notable music groups like the Press Award 2020 Finalist group Little Brazil Trio - which made it to the 20th Annual Latin Grammy Awards ballot in five categories and was a finalist at the 24th Annual USA Songwriting Competition with the original song “Vem”. She was also a semi-finalist of the Brazil Press Awards USA as Best Brazilian Singer.

Natália has worked as a session and touring vocalist for several years, recording and performing live with different artists. Her versatility as a singer led to performances of different genres all over the world.

With a Bachelor in Music at FAAM (SP-Brazil), a Degree in Vocal Performance at Los Angeles College of Music, and a Master Degree in Jazz Performance at Cornel School of Contemporary Music, she had the chance to study with renowned musicians such as Tierney Sutton, Abraham Laboriel, Dave Pozzi, and Richie Gajate Garcia.

She had the chance to perform at acclaimed venues and events like: Opening act for Universal Music platinum artist Claudia Leitte; Planeta Brasil by Globo TV; Dante Night Show - TV show co-produced between Universal Studios, Línea Abierta Group, and McFly; Summer Jazz Concert Series, NAMM Show and many more.

Collaborations are a big part of Natália’s journey, and she has teamed up with talented artists, musicians and producers like Nando Raio (Andra Day), Jonathan Richards (Demi Lovato), Nando Duarte (Melody Gardot), Marcelo Bucater (Carrie Underwood), among others.
