

SENATOR OF BUSINESS




Jordan Stemberga

SENATOR OF FINE ARTS




Angel Stormborn

SENATOR OF FINE ARTS




Melissa Cruz

SENATOR OF INDUSTRY & TECHNOLOGY




Jagger Smith

SENATOR OF MATHEMATICAL SCIENCES




Floriane Djeigo

SENATOR OF NATURAL SCIENCES




Anais Ibanez
