Public Safety Training Center Breaks Ground at El Camino College



On September 29th, El Camino College held its groundbreaking ceremony for its new South Bay Public Safety Training Center. El Camino College Board of Trustees, administrators, staff, elected officials, first responders and community leaders all celebrated the creation of the South Bay's only local public safety training site where first responders will receive life-saving skills and emergency education. The ECC Fire Academy will also call this new facility home.

Assemblymember Al Muratsuchi appropriated \$10 million for the South Bay Public Safety Training Center in 2018. The funds were approved when Governor Jerry Brown signed the 2018-19 state budget on June 27, 2018. The South Bay Public Safety Training Center will support the education of ECC's public safety students while also addressing the ongoing training requirements of South Bay firefighters and law enforcement officers.

As a longtime supporter of South Bay first responders, Assemblymember Muratsuchi said he was pleased to pursue funding for the training center project which combines his top priorities as a legislator. "This brings together two of the things I think make the South Bay such a special place to live: great schools and safe neighborhoods," he said.

The South Bay Public Safety Training Center will address two critical needs. First, the region is the only part of Los Angeles County without a designated training center for local fire, police, hazmat, emergency management, and emergency medical service agencies. Second, the current training facility for ECC's fire academy and law enforcement programs is severely limited in its ability to meet the needs of students. This large and modern facility will support the education of public safety students while

— Al Muratsuchi, Assemblymember also addressing the ongoing training requirements of firefighters and law enforcement officers, through its key design elements. Amenities include a training tower, an apparatus bay to store three engines, three classrooms, a multipurpose building, a locker room, an administration building and a training prop yard.

With the 2028 Olympics just around the corner and El Camino's close proximity to LAX, the Metro, SoFi

Stadium, other event venues and schools, public safety is in the forefront of the South Bay. El Camino College is proud to be the local training center for those who serve and protect our community and ultimately, save lives. The anticipated completion of the \$30-\$35 million facility is scheduled for late fall 2025.







Student Spotlight - LaTanya King's Comeback Story



LaTanya King is proud of the progress she's made in her education. Her comeback, as she calls it, was possible thanks to key players at El Camino College who guided her, including supportive professors, counselors, and staff members who helped her graduate from ECC and put her on a path to UCLA where she is now majoring in political science and African American studies.

And then there's

her biggest supporter and source of inspiration – her daughter Laiah. "I had to go to school for me and for Laiah, and I had to be successful. That became clear when I found myself in a situation where I didn't know how I could take care of her," King said. "And we did it together. When I would do homework, I would read to her aloud; she was with me when I studied. She went through this journey with me and went to commencement with me. I tell everyone that we are a package deal."



"The past three years I have known LaTanya, she has encountered countless obstacles that would have stopped many people in their tracks, including financial challenges, housing issues, difficult course loads, and medical emergencies for her and Laiah. I honestly cannot imagine anything that will deter LaTanya from her ambitious goals to make the world a better, more fair and just world for her little girl. I continue to be amazed not only by her resilience, but also by her unfailingly positive attitude. Along the way, she has inspired so

King enrolled at El Camino twice before, but she wasn't initially prepared for college. Then she was laid off from her job in 2020 and became a mother to Laiah. When Laiah turned 6 months old, King enrolled at El Camino once again. She took mostly online classes due to the pandemic, which also allowed her to spend time with her daughter. This time, she found her stride and earned nearly all A's and was named to the Dean's List.

many of us, including myself."

"I ended up taking a human development class that helped me to self-reflect and investigate why I struggled in school before and what I needed to do to be a better student," she said. "After that, I had the confidence to do well. Before, I felt ill prepared. I was also a first-generation college student, so I was navigating on my own and trying to figure it all out. All that changed when I found the resources available to me at El Camino and all the different people who wanted to help. I leaned into all El Camino offered and I am forever grateful to everyone who was there for me."

King is now working toward her bachelor's degree at UCLA and plans to enroll in law school. Laiah attends UCLA's preschool while LaTanya takes classes and works on campus. "El Camino helped with everything; I wasn't even going to apply to UCLA – I couldn't afford it and I never thought I could get in. El Camino showed me how all that was possible...and it's good to know that El Camino has a variety of resources to assist with the array of needs among a very diverse population of students... You are not alone on your journey."

Successful Vision 2030 Healthcare Event Held at El Camino College

California Community Colleges play a vital role in developing innovative approaches to bolster socioeconomic mobility with equity. On November 7th, El Camino College held an event on campus to showcase how changes in the healthcare industry are revolutionizing career pathways and increasing earning potential.

Speakers and panelists addressed the economic impact of the healthcare industry, its evolution, and how these changes will transform the future of healthcare in our region. Additionally, the panels discussed educational pathways in healthcare to meet increasing shortages in healthcare workers in the medical field.

The areas of focus for the day included: equitable access, innovation, labor market information and data, Career Technical Education inclusive of applied/technical baccalaureate degrees, and certificate/degree pathways inclusive of modalities such as competency-based education and credit for prior learning/prior learning assessment.
