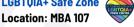

Engaging and Celebrating First-Generation Students Across Campus to Increase Retention

Location: LIB 166 - Distance Education Center First Gen

This workshop is designed to give you a variety of tools to better support El Camino College's first-gen population and give them the best chance for success. Our speakers will highlight their own experiences and approaches in responding to the needs of first-gen students. They will also discuss the strengths that first-gen students bring to our campus and address ways that El Camino College can proactively meet first-generation students where they are. In addition to explaining the importance of defining a first-generation student, we will explore ways to aid them in their college journey, starting before they even enter the classroom. This session will also discuss how El Camino College established the first-generation initiative across campus and how all campus members have a role to play.

LGBTQIA+ Safe Zone



The El Camino College Safe Zone Training Program aims to educate participants on advocacy for their LGBTOIA+ students by promoting understanding, support, and inclusivity through interactive conversations and activities. The LGBTOIA+ Safe Zone Training is an opportunity to learn about LGBTOIA+ identities, gender and sexuality, and examine prejudice, assumptions, and privilege. Topics covered in this training include Core Vocabulary, Gender, and Best Classroom/Counseling Practices.

Navigating Al Integration: A Discussion for Educators**

In this session, El Camino faculty can explore different topics around generative AI, specifically in the context of Distance Education at our campus. Participants will engage in four small-group discussions on the following topics: How AI affects equity in the online classroom; AI and online assessment design; encouraging ethical use and managing misuse of Al; and creating authentic online discussions as Al becomes an increasingly pervasive part of the online ecosystem. Participants will be asked to share their experiences, concerns, enthusiasm, and knowledge in each of these areas so that we can continue learning from one another as we traverse the increasingly complex world of online and digital education together.
