The South Bay Promise

The South Bay Promise offers an affordable pathway directly from high school to college. Enrollment fees for the first two years will be paid for full-time students and additional services and counseling will be offered to students enrolled in the South Bay Promise. New for the fall of 2019, the South Bay Promise will be available to all first-time, full-time college students (regardless of school district) who complete the necessary steps and attend El Camino immediately after graduating from high school.



Benefits:

- Free college for year one AND year two*
- Register for classes early with priority registration
- Set an academic plan for success and receive personalized counseling
- Receive free tutoring and other academic support services

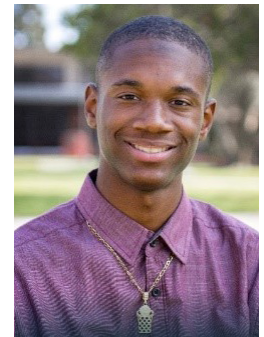

Scholarship Season

Spring is in the air which means its scholarship time at El Camino College Foundation! Last year alone, 677 scholarships totaling \$750,000 were awarded by the Foundation for the 2018-2019 academic year. Scholarships assist students with tuition, fees, textbooks and other educational expenses. Scholarships help alleviate the financial burden of college, enabling students to focus more on their studies and less time working or worrying about financial concerns, thereby creating more successful graduates.

Scholarships are an ideal way to support student success at El Camino College. The Foundation has numerous established scholarships donors can contribute to, or donors can establish new scholarships to meet their specific needs. Unquestionably, the Foundation's generous supporters make this program possible, enabling a growing number of deserving students to achieve their educational goals.

Scholarships are designed to meet the diverse needs of ECC's student population. Some are discipline specific while others reward academic excellence. Some are extended to students from local high schools, while others are intended for transferring students to four-year universities to continue their education. Finally, some scholarships are to support students with a financial need who just do not meet federal or state assistance requirements.

BQE Scholarship for Computer Science

The BQE Scholarship for Computer Science was designed specifically for students seeking a Degree or Certificate in either Business or Computer Science. Computer Science courses are designed primarily for students who wish to transfer to a four-year institution with a major in Computer Science, Physics, Mathematics, Engineering, or another technical major which concerns the study or application of computer

concepts. The courses offered provide instruction in UNIX as well as high-level languages (Java, C++), PC assembly languages and advanced programming concepts.

The BQE scholarship supports full-time students requiring financial aid and covers all coursework and incidental expenses.

Southern California Kaiser Permanente Scholarship

Established by the Kaiser Foundation on behalf of Southern CA Kaiser Permanente-Diagnostic Imaging

This two-year scholarship was established to assist Radiologic Technology students with financial assistance while they are enrolled full-time at El Camino College. The funds encourage students to continue their education and reward them as they gain professional imaging skills, training, and experience necessary to join the ranks of other Rad Tech professionals.

The scholarship helps pay for tuition, fees, books, uniforms, liability insurance and other costs associated with gaining a Rad Tech degree. The scholarship recipients must maintain a 3.0 minimum GPA. About a dozen Kaiser Permanente scholarships are awarded each year to El Camino College Radiologic Technology students.

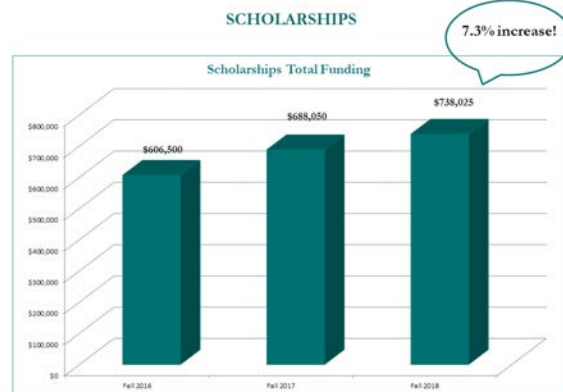

Forensics Team Wins National Titles

ECC is Top College/University in the Nation at Parliamentary Debate



The El Camino College Forensics Team won three national titles recently at the National Parliamentary Debate Association National Tournament, making El Camino College the top college or university in the nation at parliamentary debate, beating every four-year institution that competes.

Awards included the two-year tournament sweepstakes title, the two-year season sweepstakes title, and amazingly, the overall sweepstakes national championship title. This is a first for the El Camino program and only the second time in history a community college has earned the top spot.

The ECC Forensics team still has two more national tournaments to attend with the goal to bring more acclaim to El Camino College.

National Parliamentary Debate Association

The National Parliamentary Debate Association is the largest national intercollegiate debate organization in the United States, with between 200-250 schools attending at least one tournament during the year. The NPDA is about encouraging extemporaneous two-on-two debate. The NPDA believes that parliamentary debate fosters more knowledgeable and engaged citizens.

Warrior Food Pantry - Helping Students with Food Insecurities



The "Warrior Food Pantry" opened at El Camino College in the fall of 2017 and provides non-perishable food items to any ECC student who chooses to utilize the pantry. The student simply needs their current ECC student ID card to enter and select foods.

The Warrior Pantry was initiated to provide supplemental food for the homeless and food insecure students attending El Camino College. Recent studies have found that thousands of community college students show up to class hungry due to food insecurity.

Though the numbers range a bit depending upon the source, a late 2017 study of more than 30,000 college students found

that approximately half of two-year and four-year students are food insecure. In fact, at least one-third of two-year students are also housing insecure, while up to 14% are battling homelessness on top of hunger – and lack of housing goes hand-in-hand with food insecurity.

Many ECC students face serious financial challenges, and often find it difficult to support themselves while also paying for college. Research indicates that students without proper nutrition can have trouble focusing on school work and often worry about where they will find their next meal. The Warrior Pantry offers support for our students in a comfortable setting.

The Warrior Pantry assists students facing food insecurity, provides toiletries, offers access to a computer, and connects students to additional resources in a supportive environment and judgement-free zone. This year over 650 students have utilized the Pantry.

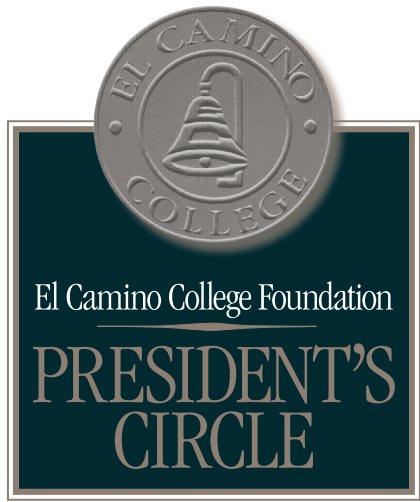
