 - B. Suppelsa reviewed the Final Proposed Budget for 2024-2025 Cover Letter
 - Since the adoption of the budget, funding for police positions has moved from general fund to parking services funds
 - With the deficit factor implemented, we are projecting a final budget with an ending balance of \$28,022,947. We need to maintain (17%) \$31,792,516 in the Emergency Conditions Reserve. However, we do have a savings plan that still needs to be implemented of \$1,080,431.
 - If we continue looking for savings this year, it will help soften the reductions for 2025-2026
 - o Review Current Status of 2025-2026 Budget and Estimated Budget Reduction Suppelsa, All
 - B. Suppelsa reviewed the Budget Leadership Ideas Cost Estimation
 - There is an assumption that there will be another deficit factor
 - We are projecting a \$5+ million problem from the state and the \$13+ million issue is a result of ECC's spending
 - Next meeting will have updates including Student Services TNC's
 - It was suggested to speak to other colleges to see how they are addressing budget issues
