## Facilities Master Plan Update – ALMA Strategies

#### 1. Overview:

- a. Douglas gave an overview of where we are with the Facilities Master Plan Update. They are working with API architects and had been selected by the College about six months ago to move forward with assisting on the Facility Master Plan Update.
- b. We use a process that is informed by data, so we want to share with you as to what some of that data is, how important it is to link Facilities, Instruction, Student Services, and Technology, so that you truly get an integrative plan that's just not focused on one aspect but multiple aspects of what's important to the College.

- 1. ALMA Strategies has walked every space in 2019 and updated the Space Inventory.

  - 2. State project of a 1.4% growth/year for enrollment, so to return to Fall 2019 enrollment it will take 12.5 years.

**Question**: has the money for 2002 measure E spent

**Answer**: the money has been expanded the bond was fully expensed as of December of 2020.

7.8 Measure E Category Budget and Balances

11.1 Public Safety Training Center - Phase 2 – *This item is not a Bond related, but a State Funded items, but we wanted the committee be aware of this project.* The Fire Academy's instructional building located in the City of Inglewood suffered fire damage in September 2020, which qualified the College for prioritized State funding through a Category A1 Final Project Proposal. Category A1 Final Project Proposals are expedited State-funded projects focused on mitigating building conditions that threaten the life or safety of the occupants. As part of the College's development of the Public Safety Training Center located at Campus Parking Lot L, the existing Fire Academy instructional building will be replaced at this site.

The new building will encompass 3,500 gross square feet and contain two classrooms and an administration office. The new facility will be the second phase of the Public Safety Training

Center project. The project design begins in FY 2023-24, and occupancy by FY 2026-27.

**Question**: When was the fire?

**Answer**: It was last year in August, and what we've done is, we have recently installed to a classroom modular building restroom and an administration building, we recently installed so now they are in the modular facility.

### October 18, 2021

- 7.21 Contract Kardent ADA Accessibility Improvement Project Phase 4

  This project, and what this consists of is this is the last phase of the project and respect to providing a handicap accessibility to three main parking lot areas. This is providing handicap accessibility improvements to the west side of the Bookstore building, currently the ramp is too steep and does not meet the ADA requirements, so this is to mitigate that issue.

**Question**: are we still doing any projects with a construction management firm called Element. **Answer**: Yes, we are, we have a contract with Element on the new Music Building.

## Facilities Bond Program Update

- 1. Behavior and Social Science building is about 40% complete; Estimate on completion is August 2022.
- 2. Arts Complex, which is under construction and is about 40% completed; Estimate on completion is August 2022.
- 3. Bookstore Café, located on the on the first floor of the Bookstore building; Estimate on completion by end of December and or first two weeks of January.
- 4. Construction Technology, is the open barn style, so students will have necessary space to carry out their construction project away from the elements. The beans have been installed, painting and asphalt work is complete. Estimate on completion is first week in December, but we are having a little bit of challenge on the supply shortage so we have extended the contract for a couple of weeks to get it completed.
- 5. Baseball field installing the synthetic turf; completed the installation of the fence and the dugouts. The restrooms are under construction and will be handicapped accessible; Estimate completion by end of November or first week in December.
- 6. Student Activities, located in the basement of the Communication building is being renovated. We have been having some challenges with unforeseen conditions as the renovation is going on, so we have been working with the contractor on a daily basis and also touring the site every day to make sure that the contractor keeps on track. Estimate on completion by end of January 2022.

**Question**: Any of these projects going over budget or having any kind of unexpected expenses happen.

**Answer:** Not at this time because a lot of has been locked in because of the bid, but the future projects we are going to see quite a bit escalation in the costs of building material by an average of 30 to 40%.

- 7. Marque, two locations, one is going to be in the corner and Manhattan Bach Blvd. on Crenshaw and the second one is going to be located on Stadium way road and Redondo Beach; Currently the project is at the Division of State Architect (DSA) for review and approval.
- 8. Music building wanted to thank the stakeholder for their input and for their vital involvement in the design process. Preparing the final plans for submission to DSA and construction will begin April 2023.
- 9. ADA projects for Phase 2 & 3, the design is 75% complete and construction will begin February 2022.
- 10. Crenshaw Traffic Signal, there is existing traffic sign, off of the Administration Building, this will be an upgrade to the mechanism to improve traffic flow coming in and out of the campus. Currently plans have been approved by the Los Angeles County Traffic Department and project will begin January 2022.
- 11. Manhattan Beach Blvd Traffic Signal is a new signal located in front of the Facilities Department, currently there is only a pedestrian walkway, which will be changed to traffic signal. Plans have been submitted to the Los Angeles County Traffic Department and project will begin July 2022.

**Question**: Jorge when the campus was empty of students for such a long time, did this allow you to accelerate construction timelines?

**Answer**: Some students were on campus, it did help that the large population of students are off-campus for the delivery of supplies and materials. There was quite a bit of vehicles that come in and out of the construction sites.
