- 1. Discussion
  - a. **Populations:** Adults (Evening & Weekend), Dual Enrollment, ESL, Full online programs, missing generation that was not able to go to college.
  - b. What do students want in a college? Flexibility in their schedule, services, child care (center on campus), employment on-campus, housing, zero cost textbooks, talk to live people, "the college life" (clubs, entertainment, connections, etc.), music at night, shuttles, food trucks, coffee, job oriented certificates and/or degrees, affordable food on-campus, onboarding process personal follow-up with student focused college with job placement, accessibility to the college, Pathway with staff cards and a "step-by-step process" (goal is to make ECC the first public institution to put an emphasis on job placement).
  - c. **How do we tell them?** Website visuals, videos, informal paths e.g. referral, friends, churches, find out where people gather (e.g. nail salon), social media, Discord, ask ASO, student driven videos, referral perks, Open House for Meta Majors, Experiential Learning, adult oriented classes.
    - i. The Call Center will be able to make calls and follow up with texts.
  - d. What do Student Services Members need now? Okay for people to talk to their managers and feel comfortable, message that students need you in person also, appointments in-person and online, videos of current staff on campus working, ask someone who is working on campus, gatherings of people (outside).
