EOPS

CARE

- The CARE program is currently accepting applications for Spring 2025. Eligible students may apply by submitting an EOPS application and CARE Certification Form. - CARE students will be required to collect meal and transportation service cards at established deadlines during the Spring 2025 semester. Students will also need to complete a required EOPS contact by the contact deadline prior to collecting service cards. Students must make an appointment with CARE staff to receive cards.
- The CARE team is finalizing programming and events for the Spring of 2025 including CARE Convo Workshops, Parent Appreciation Day Celebration, and collaboration events with Parent Café with the Child Development Department and Connections for Children.
- The CARE program closed out the Fall 2024 semester with 113 students. 106 CARE students completed all 3 required EOPS contacts. 104 CARE students received at least one set of meal and transportation cards during the Fall.
- 84 parenting students and 112 children attended the 26th Annual CARE & CalWORKs Warrior Holiday at the end of the Fall 2024 semester. Families who were unable to attend were able to collect gifts after the event. A total of 128 students and 188 children received holiday gift cards and toys. The success of
