#### **Financial Aid**

- Heavy outreach efforts for both FAFSA and CADA populations included comparing 2024-2025 records to
  previous years. ECC Contact Center connected with students who did not have a 2024-2025 financial aid
  application on file.
- A concerted effort is being made to contact mixed status students needing to complete the FAFSA application for federal aid. Many completed the CADA application for state aid consideration only (allowable as 2024-2025 exception).
- Cash for College assistance increased to every two weeks (normally two events per year).
- Verification file review will open soon, estimated in mid-June, with communication to students indicating that although documents will be collected and reviewed, schools cannot submit corrections to ED.
- Fall disbursements will be delayed for students selected for verification.
- Schools are uncertain about the reporting systems for payment until Fall 2024 begins.
- Many schools project a delay in the opening of the 2025-2026 financial aid application cycle.

- The CARE program closed out the semester with 105 students for Spring of 2024. Students who are interested in participating in the CARE program for the 2024- 2025 school year can complete a CARE interest form <a href="here">here</a>. CARE staff will contact interested students once CARE Certification form becomes available.
- 77 CARE students have completed all of their EOPS required contacts. CARE staff will be available for appointments to help CARE students complete their last required contact before the June 7<sup>th</sup> deadline. Contacts will be granted only to those who can receive advisor contact credit. All other students will be directed to complete their contacts with an EOPS counselor.

- Inter-Club Council secured funding from ASO as a special entity of \$85k for club support and student engagement






