### **Scholarships Foundation Meeting**

G. Miranda informed the committee that she had met with the Foundation Office director, Andrea Sala, to discuss establishing a study abroad scholarship. Before her departure, former director, K. Gleason had indicated that the Foundation could provide \$5000 in seed money for a scholarship. A. Sala indicated she was supportive of this request.

G Miranda also indicated that students can apply for a Benjamin Gilman International Scholarship. This is a competitive national scholarship but if students are interested they should apply.

### **Future Sites**

G. Miranda will be sending out a campus email before semester's end inviting faculty to submit proposals for a winter 2017 study abroad program. Committee members discussed possible non-European locations.

For summer 2017 two locations will be considered with one in Europe and a second in another area of the world in an effort to promote diverse locations for study abroad.

G. Miranda will check contractors who offer programs I non-European locations to get an estimate of potential costs for future study abroad programs.
