




Anthropology Enrollment by Modality – Week One



Museum Opening – Need to Prioritize

MINUTES: Museum Opening.

Department faculty agreed on the need to prioritize getting the Museum ready to open over events this Spring. It is a good idea to start thinking about Fall planning though. The Dean will ask again whether 40% reassign will roll over. The bulk of museum objects have been cataloged and stored. The remaining items consist primarily of grinding rocks which have little anthropological meaning/value. Given the limited storage space, the department discussed other possible uses.
