I) Counselor's Report – Cheryl Kroll

II) Curriculum

a) Ethnic Studies and FYE

- Chris misspoke last time. Some Anthro classes are already included in the Ethnic Studies degree options (see PP slide #4 & 5)
- It is possible that the Ethnic Studies Department may be interested in crosslisting a course with Anthropology. They would need to have the same Course Outline of Record. The department is very interested in cross-listing with Ethnic Studies, especially Anthro 6. Chris will connect the two departments to have a conversation about this.
- The department is also interested in expanding the number of sections offered through FYE.

b) Renumbering Anthro Courses

- The department is interested in renumbering courses to bring them into alignment with numbering on other campuses.
- We've been asked by the College Curriculum Committee to hold off on renumbering for a year, while we get Curriculog up and running and are still contending with working off campus.

c) Inactivating the AA Degree and Renaming Physical Anthropology

 At our last department meeting, we decided to talk about whether or not to inactivate the AA degree.

- Four students earned the AA degree, and 16 earned the AAT degree. Four is still a significant number of students in the total Anthro degrees (see PP slides 6 & 7).
- The department would like to rename Physical Anthropology to Biological Anthropology. This more closely reflects the content of the course and the course meets the Biological Sciences CSU GE, and we don't want students to make a mistake and think it's a physical science.
- [Note: After the meeting, we learned that we had already inactivated the AA degree and had already renamed Physical Anthropology to Biological Anthro and can cross both these things off our to do list.]

d) Latin American Anthropology (Rodolfo)

 The department would like to grow and this course may appeal to our student population. A survey of student interest conducted over five years ago did not show overwhelming interest in the class. It would be good to survey students again. The class is offered at Fullerton. The Latin American History class enrolls slowly each semester.

III) Enrollment – Spring 2021

Community college students across the nation are struggling and enrollment is down
in community colleges across the country and the state. This includes El Camino and
the Anthro classes. In spring we canceled one section of Anthro 1 and moved a
couple others back to second 8 week. We were able to add a second 8 week section
of Anthro 5. All adjuncts kept at least one section.

IV) Program Review and SLOs

- Rodolfo and Marianne are the leads on program review. It was postponed until next year.
- The meeting was cut off at 40 minutes and the department decided to schedule a second meeting with the primary topic of SLOs. Rodolfo would like to talk about SLOs in depth with the department.

V) Equity – How can the Dean help?

- Faculty are on the front lines of equity work in the classroom.
- The Dean can help you by getting the information/data you need. If you need data, reach out to Chris. Also, let Chris know if you need any instructional supplies that you believe would help reduce gaps, or if you think scheduling adjustments are needed.


