I) Department Business

- a) Spring Schedule and Enrollment (PowerPoint slides 3-5)
 - Spring enrollment is down across the college and in the department.
 - Enrollment patterns show a strong student preference for online CDEV classes, which have a 96% fill rate. On campus classes have a 39% fill rate.
 - Slide 4 shows a visual representation of seats filled in online, on campus, and hybrid sections
 - The program is offering 36 sections this semester, whereas in the past two Spring semesters it has offered 39.
- b) Summer Schedule (PP slide 6)
 - The summer schedule is currently being built. Right now, we are planning for 8 sections, which is 1 or 2 sections fewer than in the past. If sections fill, we can add more.
 - Program faculty would like to offer a CDEV 125 practicum section this summer for students who were unable to enroll in the course this spring and need to complete the AST. The grant does not fund mentors for summer sections. Chris will request funding. Also, the yearly uncertainty of the grant and its inability to cover all mentors in the past year has become a problem. The practicum is necessary for completion of the AST. The cost is \$6,250 per class. Four sections per year should be sufficient and the cost would be \$25,000. Chris will put the request for ongoing College funding in the division plan.

- c) PLOs/SLOs and Curriculum (slide 7)
 - The CDEV SLO timeline in Nuventive that is listed on slide 7 is inaccurate. Janet and
 Michelle will correct it and share it with their colleagues. CDEV 169 should be removed –
 it has been inactivated.
 - The Fall 2021 SLO assessments are all completed and entered into Nuventive.
 - No curriculum is due at this time.
- ci) Updating Pathways and the Website (Slides 8-10)
 - The division will be working on updating department webpages and making them more informative and engaging to students. Department faculty should email updates to Chris.
 - BSS programs will be updating their pathways. Chris will email out the pathways later this semester to be reviewed by department faculty.

- cii) BSS Metamajor Counselor Report Cheryl Kroll

- ciii) Guided Pathways
 - ALL CDEV 103 faculty will be given a link to share with students. Counselors wants to make sure that all students in this gateway course to other CDEV classes have an Ed Plan.
- civ) LACOE Grant
 - Everything is going well.
 - Michelle took over managing the grant from Jennifer when she retired. It pays for SuperTutors who are back on campus two days a week, and the Permit Specialist, Nancy Alvarez.
 - Over the summer, when the grant can't pay, there is no money for Super Tutors or the permit specialist.
 - Offers classes for Head Start teachers.
 - We will probably get the LACOE grant again next year, but grants are never guaranteed.
- cv) Janet Young
 - It is a shame that CDEV has never received the support it needs from ECC administration. The CDEV program has cobbled together grants and scraped together money to fund essential services that should have a stable funding source.
- cvi) Cynthia Cervantes
 - TUSD is developing a Childhood Education pathway beginning in high school. In Fall 2023, they would like to use their teachers, which has been made possible by revisions to the faculty contract. TUSD understands that CDEV faculty will determine whether high school applicants meet the minimum qualifications. They will then interview and request a teaching demonstration. If the TUSD instructor is hired then they ECC instructor will mentor them.
 - You and Me Play Groups are meeting on the first Saturday of the month.

- Two new school age playgroups are meeting.
- Pandemic Parenting sessions are continuing. There will be about 6 sessions on Fridays.
- Trauma Informed Care Workshops were very successful in Fall 100 faculty, staff and students attended. Drew Corporation and Connections for Children have expressed interest in these courses.
- The Assistant Director of Cal Works and EOPS is collecting data on parents with the intention to provide more support to students, faculty and staff.
- Guardian Scholars has approached the CDEV club re: a parent coop on campus.
- Cynthia and Janet will work on the CDEV student success report for the Board of Trustees and send it to the VPAA.
- CDEV 125 one section should be offered in Fall 2022, not two. It will take a semester to start building up the mentorship sites again.
- CDEV is required for the AST. Students want the AST, but can transfer without it.
- Degree Planner does not make it clear to students that they can transfer without it.

f) Michelle Moen

• Child Development Training Consortium (CDTC) – The grant no longer provides pay to the coordinator, so Michelle is doing this on her own time. Each student is refunded \$49 per unit in Fall 2022. It is possible there is no funding for this Spring 2022.

g) Janice

 TEACH El Camino is still recruiting. They have partnerships with SB Promise, the Black Students Union and Guided Pathways. Workshops with CSULB and CSUDH. The Future Teachers Club will meet on March 18th.

h) Yadira

- CPTP has 95 students (the goal is 100). A few more are in the pipeline to apply.
- There are 45 mentors and they just need 5 more.
- They are working with Inglewood to create \$20 paid position for our students.



Program assessment will be conducted regularly through examinations, presentations, student self-assessment, portfolios, and tracking student employment and promotion in the teaching field.
