



## <u>Curriculum</u>

**Economics** – The department discussed removing ECON 101 as a prerequisite for ECON 102. After careful consideration and review of success rates, the faculty decided to keep the prerequisite in place (even though removing it might increase enrollment). ECON 102 is a much more difficult course than ECON 101, and students in ECON 102 need the math in ECON 101 to be successful. Success rates are high in ECON 102 with the prerequisite. Students may petition to wave the prerequisite under certain circumstances.
