#### III) Spring Schedule and Enrollment (PowerPoint Slides 8-11)

- Spring 2023 section count decreased by 1 but enrollment increased by 14% from spring 2023. Fill rate for online classes are higher than the other modalities.
  - Sections offered ranged from 72-78 Spring 2020-Spring 2023
- Discussed students influence on scheduling classes in future semesters.
  - Decreased the number of on campus classes due to low fill rates

- More online sections
- Flexible schedule to meet student modality needs
- Summer sections offered have steadily decreased from Summer 2020 to Summer 2023

#### IV) Student Success and Gap Data (PowerPoint slides 12-17)

- The number of AAT degrees awarded has increased over 2016-2022
  - Pyschology is the 2<sup>nd</sup> largest degree issuing program
    - 74.8% of degrees issued have gone to female identifying students.
    - 70.40% have been students in the 20-24 age group
- Success rates have decreased across division.
- The faculty discussed the increase in the use of Chatbots for cheating and discussed the need to shift instruction in response.
  - The dean will schedule session discussing cheating and financial aid fraud.
- In considering the expansion in equity gap for African American students, the faculty pointed to life situations as one possible cause, such as employment.



# Spring 2023 Enrollment – Seats Filled and Unfilled








## Ethnicity of 2021-22 Psychology AAT Awardees (dark blue bar)







## Gender of Awardees




# Age Group of Awardees


