Courses completed at other regionally accredited United States colleges or universities must be equivalent to El Camino College courses. For determination of course equivalency, course descriptions (must come from the specific catalog year in which the course was taken may be available at http://www.collegesource.org/) must accompany official transcripts . No course descriptions are required for prerequisites completed at El Camino College. All prerequisite courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or better and the final grade must be posted on the transcript. For any course in which a grade of "C" or better was earned, the EARLIEST course grade will be utilized. Failure to submit transcripts with all grades posted will result in disqualification from the application process.
