2. The Power of Process

(Suzanne Gates)

(Power of Process handout distributed – perhaps attach handout to the minutes)

S. Gates working w/ McGraw Hill on PoP software. SG will present software and ask faculty if they want to beta test the software. SG: Had an idea of a software program that allows instructors to superimpose the various elements of the critical reading process on a given text. E.g., Predict, find the main idea, find supporting details, summarize the text, confirm prediction. After completing the process, the students end up with an artifact of their reading process (with annotations, highlighted passages).

Instructor side: Instructors can choose to limit readings or let students choose readings. Instructors will be able to choose what elements go in the "process wheel." Each strategy is aligned with a particular area of Bloom's taxonomy, and there is also an explanation of how that particular strategy is relevant to the development of reading skills.

The PoP software will be part of the Connect software that comes free with ECC writer's handbook from McGraw Hill. Should be available in spring 2014. Beta test will take place during fall 2013.

McGraw Hill has extended the period of time during which students can access software.
