1. SLO/PLO BUSINESS

1.1 English 1C SLO # 3 revised to improve awkward wording:

NEW and IMPROVED: Students will organize write an essay that is technically correct in MLA format, paragraph composition, sentence structure, grammar, spelling, and usage. [strikeouts/revisions indicate revisions made in meeting. See Item 1.2 below].

- OLD and AWKWARD: Students will o<u>rganize an essay in proper MLA format and will also be</u> technically correct in paragraph composition, sentence structure, grammar, spelling, and usage.
- 1.2 The department noted that the "New and Improved" version is still awkward and unwieldy and voted for an on-the-spot fix. The following English 1C SLO #3 was unanimously approved: Students will write an essay that is correct in MLA format, paragraph composition, sentence structure, grammar, spelling, and usage.
