



PSYCHOLOGY – TRANSFER REQUIREMENTS

The following requirements for the major are subject to change without notice. To assure that this information is current, you should consult with a Psychology counselor, or review articulation agreements via the Internet at WWW.ASSIST.ORG. You may also consult the Articulation Officer for specific articulation agreements.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES: Psychology is the study of human behavior. Psychologists study the biological, physiological and genetic causes of behavior, as well as the emotional, social, and developmental factors involved. Psychology can be the foundation for a master's degree program in school counseling or for such fields as law, medicine, religion, government, management, marketing and industrial relations. Many positions require a Ph.D. Clinical and Counseling Psychologists use psychotherapy to modify the behavior of mentally and emotionally disturbed people. Community psychologists work with mental health organizations and welfare agencies. Developmental psychologists are concerned with changes in behavior from infancy through maturity. Experimental psychologists study behavior of people and animals (learning, motivations, emotion, sensation, perception, and the physiological bases of behavior). Industrial psychologists work on the interactions between people and machines in industrial situations.

ASSOCIATE DEGREE FOR TRANSFER (AA-T)

Students who have completed the AA-T in Psychology will have a strong academic foundation in the field and will be prepared for upper division baccalaureate study at the university. This coursework will satisfy most of the lower-division requirements at many institutions within the California State University system. This degree is intended for students who major in Psychology and may provide priority consideration for admission to a CSU.

Students considering transferring to a UC, private, or out of state university: Please consult with a counselor before applying to transfer since transfer requirements may be slightly different than those required for the AA-T.

Psychology 101 (may be satisfied with score of 4 or higher on AP psychology exam); select one from: Anthropology 1 or 1H, Biology 110-120-130, or Physiology 31; select one social science course from Anthropology 2 or 2H, Philosophy 112, Political Science 1, 2, or 7 or Sociology 101; select one course from: Math 190, 191, 210, or 270 or Math 150 or 150H or Computer Science 8

***Students must complete either 1) UCB's L & S requirement in reading and composition, foreign language, and quantitative reading or 2) IGETC by the end of the spring term prior to fall transfer. Students must also have a 3.0 GPA in all lower division prerequisite coursework.**

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, DAVIS (2022-23)

Psychology 101; Math 150 or 150H or Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A; Psychology 109B; Biology 110 or 110H alone OR Biology 10 or 10H with Anthropology 1 or Anatomy 30 or Physiology 31

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, IRVINE

Psychological Sciences: Psychology 101 and 107, 108 or 115; Psychology 109B; Math 150 or Sociology 109A or Psychology 109A; Administration of Justice 100. This degree provides students with a foundation to pursue graduate work in the areas of public health, health services, human resources, social work, counseling, law, education and related fields.

B.S. Psychology: Psychology 101 and 107; Psychology 108 or 115; four courses from Math 190 or 191, Biology 110 or 110H, Biology 120 or 120H, Chemistry 1A-1B, or Physics 3A-3B; and six courses from Chemistry 7A-7B, Math 190, 191 and 270, Physics 1A and 1C, or Philosophy 106. This degree focuses on the study of the mind and brain.

Note: While not required for admission, all social sciences majors must satisfy a mathematics requirement.

Courses at ECC that fulfill this requirement are Math 190 and Math 150 or Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA, LOS ANGELES

B.A. in Psychology: Psychology 101; Biology 10 or 10H or Biology 110 or 110H or Physiology 31 or Anatomy/Physiology 34A and 34B or Biology 120; one physical science course from: Chemistry 4 or 4H or 20 or 21A or 1A or Physics 2A or 11 or 3A or 1A; Phil 101 or 103 or 105 or 106 or 107 or 111; one quantitative reasoning course from: Math 150 or Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A or Computer Science 1 or Communications 180 or Math 190. Note: A score of 4 or higher on the following AP exams may be used to meet major prep: Psychology, Biology, Physics B or C, Chemistry, Statistics or Calculus. (The UCLA Department of Psychology prefers that students complete a statistics course to meet the quantitative reasoning requirement).

B.S. in Psychobiology: Psychology 101; Biology 110-120 or 110H-120H; Chemistry 1A and 1B; Chemistry 7A and 7B; Mathematics 150 and Life Science 30A and 30B at UCLA or Mathematics 190 and 191 and 220 or Mathematics 165 and Mathematics 3B and 3C at UCLA; Physics 3A and 3B or 1A, 1C and 1D (*this is a highly selective major, a significant number of preparatory courses should be completed before transfer)

Note: *Transfer students must be admitted as Pre-Psychology majors in order to major in Psychology. Students originally admitted under other majors will not be permitted to change their major to Pre-Psychology or Psychology*

or to double major in Psychology. It is recommended that major preparation be completed by the fall prior to transfer.

Psychological and Brain Sciences: Psychology 101 or 101H; Math 165 or 190; Math 150 or 150H (recommended); Biology 110 or 110H and 120 or 120H and 130 and Chemistry 1A and 1B OR Chemistry 1A-1B and MCDB6 and EEMB7 at UCSB; and four courses from Anthropology 1 or 1H, 2 or 2H, 4, Chemistry 1A, 1B, Computer Science 1, Computer Science 14, Geology 1 and 3, Geology 2 and 4, Economics 101 or 101H, Economics 102, Biology 110 or 1110H-120 or 120H-130, Biology 15, Geography 2, Biology 10 or 10H, Math 165, 191, 270, Philosophy 103, 106, Physics 1A, Physics 1A and 1B, Physics 1A, 1B, and 1C, Physics 2A or 3A, Physics 2A-2B, Physics 3A-3B, Political Science 7 or Philosophy 117

B.A. Psychology: **One** statistics course from Math 150 or Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A; **one** course from Math 190 or Philosophy 106; **two** courses from: Biology 10 or 10H, Biology 110-120, or Physiology 31; **one** course from Chemistry 4, 1A, 1B, Physics 11, 3A, 3B, 1A, 1B, or 1C; **one** introduction to computer programming course chosen from Computer Science 2 or 3 or 17; and Psychology 107 and 109B

B.S. Psychology: **One** statistics course from Math 150 or Psychology 109A or Sociology 109A; Psychology 109B, Math 190 and Math 191; **three** courses from: Biology 10 or 10H, Biology 110-120, or Physiology 31; **one** course from Chemistry 4, 1A, 1B, Physics 11, 3A, 3B, 1A, 1B, or 1C; **one** introduction to computer programming course chosen from Computer Science 2 or 3 or 17; and Psychology 107
